

OVERNIGHT VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Lazarus House is looking for help with overnight volunteering. Currently we have 13 overnight spots a month that we are looking to fill. We need individuals 21+ to come in regularly each month OR to fill in as needed.

A Lazarus House trained staff member is present & awake the whole night. Our overnight volunteer sleeps during their shift, only to be called on by Operations Staff to be present should staff need to handle a quick emergency on site.

Overnighters can arrive between 9:00 and 10:00pm, then wake and leave any time after 6am to end the shift.

Please note that all overnighters will have access to:

*A regularly sanitized & private sleeping space

*A volunteer key to staff restrooms

- -a lot goes into keeping people fed, housed and supported
- -expect the unexpected
- -human connection & dignity are essential
- -as a team we can brainstorm and figure out solutions
- -learning the names, faces, fears and hopes of those we serve
- -we are not changing peoples' lives, but giving them the safety needed to grow
- -importance of taking the time to really listen to everyone's story and practice the opportunity to honor the dignity of each guest
- -to be open-minded to what may come on any given day to accommodate a client's needs

In 2021, Geneva Lutheran Church (GLC) voted to support several local missions, Lazarus House being one of them. Along with another congregational member, I met with Julie and Megan to learn more about the services provided to those needing hope for the future. Wow! I had no idea that so much was happening beyond providing shelter. We asked, where can we help? We were immediately challenged with organizing a clothes closet, and I took it on. With Megan's help we gathered clothes stored throughout the building into one central location. To help staff quickly find what was needed, GLC

purchased several clear plastic bins which were labeled to identify what was inside. I periodically check on the closet, organizing new donations and identifying gaps to be filled. The staff make this chore a joy.

But that's not all, Lazarus House sends out quarterly newsletters, like the one you're reading now! Our congregation enjoys the fellowship of sitting at tables and preparing the materials for mailing.
