It was about a former leader who was going through treatment for a cancer diagnosis. Several days before, she lost all her hair, arrived in a wig and delivered her speech. "*At one of the lowest* 

points in my life, someone didn't count me out," she said, tearing up. "It was just such a message that I needed at that point in time. That I had value, that I could contribute and participate. I felt HOPE at a time when I thought that maybe HOPE isn't what I was going to get." Wow, does this apply to working here at Lazarus House. The italicized line above really made me rethink how I greet those who show up at the door. I shared this message with our team here, wanting to acknowledge the value of our opportunities to help make our guests feel significant, worthy and that they count. I feel grateful to be surrounded by caring individuals, whether staff, volunteers, or donors who choose to offer HOPE to others.

Lazarus House has an entire department geared towards preventing homelessness. While we love to be there to support people when they become homeless, I think

we can all agree, it is better when people do not need an emergency homeless shelter.

To that goal, we have four programs within our Homeless Prevention Services department that all seek to prevent homelessness in different ways. These programs offer one-time or short term rent/utility assistance, while the others focus on longer term support.


In our corner of the Lazarus House shelter building, our team of dedicated case managers meet weekly with clients in our Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program. Our PSH clients are like family to us here at Lazarus House. When you donate items like full-size deodorant and shampoo, we stock it in our Homeless Prevention Pantry that our clients get to "shop" before their case management meetings. These donations also assist clients in our medium-term, step-down rental assistance program. Those donations are a real lifesaver for our clients when they fall on especially hard times.

When a landlord is interested in one of our grant programs, to be used for one of their apartments, we are the ones who pick up the call. As the need for housing cost assistance grows, so do our programs. Though there is no way to know as an outside observer, many apartments throughout St. Charles, Geneva, and Batavia are subsidized through Lazarus House's Homeless Prevention Services.




A Guest Story



Sean, a resident in our transitional living program, was unexpectedly granted custody of his teen son, Billy. Sean now found himself as a full-time parent, with a full-time job and was a part-time student at ECC working on a trade license. Sean was eligible for our HPS Rapid Rehousing program funded through a grant, and Lazarus House was able to secure a landlord who was open to working with this program. For the first time in this young boy's life, Billy was going to have his own room and could not wait to decorate it. Because Billy's dad was trying to be diligent about saving their money, there wasn't a lot left over for decorating. Random Acts Matter, a local organization, provided a wonderful basket filled with wish list items for this father/son team and was also able to connect with a company who hosted a drive in their office for teenage room décor. Billy was beyond thrilled to receive all these wonderful items. By the grace of our community, we were also able to find all the necessary furniture donations. So on a beautiful fall day, with the help of many volunteers, we moved this family into their first home together. Sean's comment, as the volunteers were leaving that day, was "thank you for helping to make an apartment into a home!"

When guests leave the shelter, I would have resources that continue the reset process. I would have several workforce development buildings, strategically located, where guests can get additional tools on their pathway to independence, personal empowerment. All programs would be for free for as long as the guest would like.

What lasting lesson have you learned during your time at Lazarus House? I have learned that our guests are courageous just by knocking on the door for help. I have learned that all ages, all status, may be in need of a shelter reset. I have learned that a shelter must set clear parameters, clear goals and expectations. This what works for people to change their lives. Providing food and shelter is not enough to help a person be their best self. Lazarus House offers a pathway to personal success by ensuring counseling, healthcare, a positive clean safe atmosphere, excellent leadership and dedicated staff.
