



It's been an honor to lead this mission alongside such dedicated staff, volunteers, donors, and most importantly, our guests. Together, we've navigated immense challenges—especially during the pandemic—while achieving meaningful progress:





- Expanded capacity by transforming the Sanctuary space into a safe space for women and children
- Reimagined our major fundraiser into the more-casual, community-driven Posh Picnic
- Launched a new affordable housing program, providing fully furnished, independent shared housing spaces for guests
- Introduced *Bridge*, a housing program that helps guests secure apartments with Lazarus House acting as a supportive partner and advocate



Women and Children's Day Center — Mental health is a common struggle for many of our guests. Mary arrived at Lazarus House after spending the last year working to improve this struggle in her life. Mary fell into what seemed to be an inescapable depression after facing an eviction and consequently being shunned from her children. She lost the only place she could call home, but even worse, she lost those who mattered most to her.

When Mary came to Lazarus House, she felt lost. She dwelled on the past, wondering what she could have done differently for another outcome. After a couple of weeks, Mary started to open up to staff. Little by little, Mary regained her motivation and confidence. There were some bumps along the way, but Mary finally found housing and has been independent ever since! We so admire Mary's persistence. She shared that "everything happens for a reason," and that "there truly is light at the end of the tunnel."

Men's Emergency Shelter — Louis came to Lazarus House when he faced challenges with affording his rent and was at risk of eviction. Gratefully, he was able to leave before receiving an eviction. Louis is a veteran, but had never explored the benefits available through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. As soon as Louis arrived at Lazarus House, we were able to connect him with those resources that he deserved. While he was at Lazarus House, Louis worked hard on his employment and saved every penny he earned.

With encouragement and ongoing support, Louis was able to follow through on the affordable housing for which he was eligible. His Veteran status also enabled him to receive additional financial support that helped greatly with his move. Louis has remained a part of the Lazarus House community, where he is always welcome for meals and camaraderie. We are incredibly proud of his perseverance and grateful for his service. Today, we celebrate Louis and his new home with heartfelt joy!

Center for Transitional Living — Angie came to our emergency shelter after losing the apartment she could no longer afford. Her path was shaped by past abuse and a recent PTSD diagnosis, yet she remained determined to rebuild her life.

Adjusting to communal living was difficult, as being around a lot of people caused Angie great anxiety, but she stayed. She committed to working hard on her mental health and sobriety through Lighthouse Recovery. Employed as a part-time bus monitor for children with special needs, she also spent several hours each week volunteering at a local animal shelter. Her dedication earned her a spot in our two-year transitional housing program. With space to heal, Angie began to thrive.

A major hurdle came when she needed 15 teeth removed to prepare for dentures. The experience caused intense anxiety, but a compassionate dentist guided her through the seven visits. Receiving dentures transformed her confidence. With a new smile and renewed spirit, Angie secured a full-time role as a paraeducator supporting children with severe disabilities—a job she embraced wholeheartedly.

After a year of hard work and growth, Angie was presented with a rare opportunity: a place in Lazarus House's Rental Housing Support program. She moved into her own apartment with income-based rent, finally finding a stable and affordable home.

Her journey is a powerful reminder of what's possible with support, opportunity, and determination.

Homeless Prevention Services — Rachel and Dan arrived at Lazarus House with their two children, Julia and Michael after losing their home that they could no longer afford. Being a family in a homeless shelter is already a struggle, but for Rachel and Dan it was even harder. Both Rachel and Dan have profound hearing loss and use American Sign Language as their only mode of communication.

This family had now found themselves in an unfamiliar shelter, where they couldn't communicate very well with many people because of their deafness. Luckily, their assigned case manager had taken years of ASL classes. This was such a positive coincidence that profoundly impacted their stay at Lazarus House. After months of job searching with no luck, Rachel was awarded SSI. This was a great financial addition to the social security income that Dan was already receiving.

Things fell into place when this family was accepted into a rental housing support program. Their kind and generous landlord bought a new mop, kitchenware, towels, cleaning supplies, and more for this family to start fresh in their new home. Rachel came to my office on their last day in shelter, and pointed at the picture frame in my office that says, "Yes girl, you can". She said, "That quote has made me stay optimistic. I'm so relieved that my family and I persevered through the hard things. Look where that's gotten us today!"
